

English:


Our English learning this term is based on the book 'The Great Kapok Tree' by Lynne Cherry. This story is based on two men who visit a rainforest to cut down trees however, one man discovers the importance of the tree and changes his mind. The book explores important issues of deforestation through a colourfully illustrated story.

We will continue to develop our understanding of organising our writing through the use of headings/subheadings. As well as using a range of fronted adverbials and expanded noun phrases to add precise detail to our writing.

Reading:

Our reading sessions will involve using non-fictions texts to clarify the meaning of technical vocabulary and the retrieval of information on rainforests. We will also continue to develop our inference skills on the actions and motives of characters through our book 'The Great Kapok Tree'.

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How can we make a difference?

Spelling:

This half term, we will be exploring a variety of homophones and near homophones. We will understand the meaning of the words and in what context each one should be used and then how we can spell them correctly.





Science:

Throughout our Research Project we will be exploring the enquiry question 'How can we make a difference?' This will involve understanding food chains and what food chains we have in our local environment. We will reflect on the impact humans can have on these food chains and how they can become imbalanced. Leading us to think about what we can do to help.

We will also be identifying and labelling different types of human teeth and their functions.

Also, the human digestive system and describing how it works.
